The ADSB House Building program is a well-established partnership with SalDan Construction Group where students participate in a semester long experience, earning 4 credits and industry recognized certifications while working on a construction site. The House Building Teacher is responsible for delivering a comprehensive, hands-on construction technology program focused on residential home building. The teacher will guide students through the full cycle of construction—from design and planning to framing, finishing, and project completion—while fostering strong safety practices, employability skills, and connections to the skilled trades. This role is central to ADSB’s commitment to experiential learning, pathways exploration, and supporting students’ readiness for apprenticeships, the workplace, and post-secondary opportunities.

Additionally, the successful candidate will:

- have experience in a variety of technological education sectors including construction, manufacturing, and electrical;
- be familiar with SHSM, OYAP and the apprenticeship pathway;
- have the skills to work both as part of a team, and independently;
- have strong written and oral communication skills;

- have excellent interpersonal skills;
- have proven leadership and organizational skills;
- have demonstrated a commitment to continuous professional development.

Duties will include but are not limited to:

- deliver Co-operative Education and Technological Education curriculum through hands-on, project-based learning;
- deliver appropriate safety-related training;
- arrange for industry-standard certification opportunities;
- possess the ability to liaise with school board staff and the program sponsor to coordinate program delivery;
- work collaboratively with Sa/Dan Construction Group management and employees and ADSB staff;
- be aware and comply with all responsibilities associated with Health and Safety and Board Policies;
- demonstrate proficiency in computer skills which include Microsoft applications;
- carry out other duties as assigned from time to time.

The successful applicant will have opportunities to shadow the current teacher between April and June to support the transition for 2026-2027.
