



Intentional Instruction/Assessment & Intervention

How do you intentionally create a classroom environment that is inclusive and reflective of the individual students, builds on their strengths and meets their learning needs?



Classroom teachers are the key educators for students' development. Classroom intervention is a set of steps a teacher takes to help a child improve in their area of need. At times, specific students will benefit from the support of other members of the school community (SERT, P/VP, etc.) Collaborative efforts and interventions address the needs of all students.

Reflections to Consider

Tier 1 – Intentional (ALL) How will you focus on the overall expectations while considering the big ideas? What are the learning needs, of your students based on assessment information you have, reflecting on the most recent observations and conversations? How are you adjusting instruction in response to "in the moment" assessment information?

Tier 2 – Targeted (SOME) What additional information do you need to further understand the learning needs of the student? As you reflect on the student response to your instructional and assessment practices in tier 1, what do you need to adjust and how will you monitor the impact of your adjustments?

Tier 3 – Personalized (FEW), Which specific students and learning needs will the intervention target and how will you personalize the instruction and assessment? Which members of the school team can you collaborate with to provide the necessary support (i.e. SERT, etc.)? provide one-on-one/small group targeted intervention?

Healthy Schools – promoting health and positive life choices

Equity – providing environments that are reflective of the diverse identities found within ADSB school communities

All projects must be **student-led** and identify a student lead, advisor, and indication of approval of the school's principal or designate.


