Vision

The Vision of the Algoma District School Board Alliance Academy is that learners in ADSB engage in innovative experiences that maximize achievement, build confidence, and develop responsible citizens.

The Alliance Soccer Academy is open to all students in grades 9 and 10, and some 11's if space permits, at each Sault Ste. Marie secondary school.

The ADSB Alliance Soccer Academy will help student athletes learn and improve advanced individual skills and tactics, while developing a lifestyle in and away from their sport that emphasizes building character through achieving both athletic and educational success.

Purposeful practices led by highly trained staff, strength and conditioning designed to maximize physical attributes, and a focus on leadership, character and confidence will all position the student to achieve their individual goals in an engaging environment.

High School Program (grades 9 and 10) – Second Semester Only

- Paired programming for success: PAL 10/20, (Physical Education - large group activities) and ENL 1W (Grade 9 destreamed English) **OR** IDC 30 (grade 10 Soccer curriculum course)
- 70 hours of indoor and outdoor field time dedicated to skill development, 3-4 times a week.
- 40 hours of sport specific training (gym and weight room)
- 110 hours of grade 9 destreamed English **or** grade 10 Soccer curriculum course.
- Instruction from a qualified teacher and community skills expert.





Fee Structure

The fee for this program is \$500.00. A **\$100.00 deposit is due with a completed registration form**. The remaining \$400.00 is due on or **before September 11, 2026** (School Cash On-line is the preferred method of payment, or by credit card)

Included with the fee:

- 110 hours of Soccer instruction on turf, in the gym, and in the weightroom.
- 110 hours of instruction from a Soccer qualified teacher or community skills instructor
- Regular morning transportation by school bus to Korah. Lunch time transportation to students' home school.
- Soccer Ontario workout T- shirt and shorts.

Financial assistance is available and will be reviewed on a case by case basis by request.

Transportation

High school students will access eligible bus routes each morning from their home, arriving at Korah no later than 8:30 AM. Transportation will be provided by the Algoma District School Board for students to return to their home schools at lunch time. High school students will attend afternoon classes at their home schools each day.

Equipment

Students are responsible for their own footwear. The Alliance Academy will supply students with a T-shirt and shorts that they should wear for workouts on the field, in the gym, and in the weight room. Soccer balls and all other training equipment will be provided for students. We encourage students to have proper soccer training shoes/cleats as well as a pair of running shoes dedicated for use in the academy.

Admission Requirements

Enrolment in this program is limited thus, we cannot guarantee a spot for all applicants. Acceptance will be based on: work habits, consistent learning skills and regular attendance. Once program selection has been made by committee, a waiting list will be generated.

Registration

Current Grade 9 ADSB students will select the ADSB Alliance Soccer Academy during the course selection process.

For any current Grade 8 students or Grade 9 students from other boards, please choose the ADSB Alliance Soccer Academy on your option selection sheet when registering at your home school or choose in My Blueprint.

Use School Cash On-line to pay the \$100.00 deposit when you apply. Balance of \$400.00 to be paid through School Cash On-line by the end of the first week of school in September.

The selection committee will review applications and confirm registration prior to the start of the school year.
